### **Pastor's Corner**

Dear people of St. John's,

Finally winter has appeared along with the colder temperatures and snow. Seems to me, each winter, we are confronted with the dilemma of, do we cancel church or do we attempt continue with a service, depending on weather conditions. In my opinion it is always better to err on the side of safety, especially when the roads and walkways are snow covered and slippery.

We have gone through another year and our annual meeting laid out the groundwork for another successful year. I have never experienced a better annual meeting and our vestry and other church leaders must be proud of their accomplishments, not only for the church, but for every member of St. John's. To be successful all members are called to contribute and it is plain to see....They have.

Despite the weather conditions we are approaching Ash Wednesday and Lent, probably faster than most of us would appreciate. Epiphany will be concluding with Jesus' transfiguration on the mountain-top, along with Moses, Elijah, and three con-

fused disciples. We also hear the voice from the cloud, "listen to him."

The readings include images of light and mountains. In the Bible, significant religious



events occur on a mountain, because God was described as dwelling above the earth, and when appearing, only coming down as far as the top of a mountain. Today people speak of having "mountain-top experiences," when experiencing a significant spiritual event.

God is not only brilliant light, but also a cloud. In the Bible the cloud is a mysterious sign of the presence of God. You could say, it is as if God covers the earth, brings life, affects much, and then suddenly vanishes. You could also say, as a cloud, God rains down the waters of baptism.

Lent is a season of repentance, renewal, and baptism. Yes, we will have baptisms on Easter Sunday; however, I invite each of you to read (BCP, 264-265, and BCP, 379. The prayer book has given us a

Thanks to these folks for volunteering their time and consideration for this very important series of Conventions.

**The Sr. Warden Report** included a pictorial review of 2023's key events and experiences. The key words for 2023 were *Dismayed*, *Sustained and* 

Blessed. The surprising departure of Fr. Tom Man-

ney was certainly dismaying but St. John's was sustained throughout the year by Rev. Mary Jo Schuetz, Rev. Barb Cavin and special liturgies. Our concerts, garage sales, Xmas Bazaar and outreach continued to do well. But



most important, this congregation was a blessing throughout the year. Each of us tried just a little harder to be there for each other. The end of the year brought the blessing of having Fr. Harold join St. John's.

2024 will include more concerts, community events and outreach. We hope to have a Sunshine Service again this year. And Fr. Harold is already lining up Lenten Classes for Feb. and March. We are planning a post-service class on February 25<sup>th</sup> on LGBTQ+ 101 facilitated by Beckett LeClaire. And we may have a field trip March 2nd to help Beckett and Kaye's fix-up/clean-up work at the Inclusion Center in Mio. So far, the new year looks like fun!

The Jr. Warden report was appropriately lengthy. Jack Dodd and Ida Lynn have been very busy this year with multiple projects — Finishing installation of the mechanized bell, creating a new cross for our Easter service, painting the front sign, sprucing up the garden spaces, refurbishing the Narthex ceiling and cleaning up the paneling and generally organizing the space, continued efforts to improve our wiring and bring things up to code, getting the sanctuary doors refinished and hung. And then there's the ongoing battle with weeds in our parking lot! We all appreciate the work these two members have done. There was a special recognition in the meeting to let them know we see and value their contributions.

In 2024, there will be continued work on the Narthex – some light colored paint on the upper walls to brighten up the space, more wiring work for a new light in the Narthex and separate breakers for the furnace and sump pump in the basement, investigating the cost of painting OR siding the exterior of the church, initial estimates for blacktopping the parking lot. And there's always unexpected items that appear during the year. There's no doubt that the building and grounds are in good hands.

**Treasurer's Report** – This is covered in another article. Bottom line looks great! Budget for 2024 was approved.

Pastor's Report – Fr. Harold expressed his joy in being part of St. John's and outlined some of his plans for 2024. He talked about the Lenten classes, a chance to use "Enriching Our Worship" in our liturgy, his enthusiasm for going out to visit folks who can't always get to church. He is beginning a weekly prayer service at The Bell's assisted living facility in Almont this month. This could definitely grow!

Connie Ogg asked that we include BCP page number references in our service bulletins.

Kitty Underwood suggested that we place copies of the bible in the pews – perhaps one per pew.

Many thanks to the participants for their careful attention and for the MARVELOUS pot-luck that everyone enjoyed. I can't wait to see what 2024 has in store for St John's.

Let's have a chance to share sweet things with each other before Lent begins. If you're feeling




like pancakes, go for it! Or if you want to bring something Valentiny, by all means! Or maybe you could do both! This will be our last chance until the end of March (Easter)!

### **Treasurer's Report**

We finished 2023 with a totally awesome bottom line.

**Pledge Donations:** We had some donations **well above** amounts originally pledged. 2023 donations were \$7,000 higher than expected. The generosity of this congregation is amazing. Total Income includes funding from the Curacy Pgm and our concerts.

#### Budget Helpers – Under budget

• Utilities	Under by \$1,668	Thank you, Mother Nature! This is always difficult to predict. Better under by a bunch than over by a bunch
• Lawn/Snow/ Trash	Under by \$ 1,349	This is related to minimal snow removal last year. Similar to the point above – difficult to predict.
Maintenance	Under by \$1,143	Some of the work done this year came from Restricted Funds so this account was not utilized much.
• Office Supplies	Under by \$1,035	We had a couple of lucky breaks with supplies this year. 2024 budget is lower

#### **Restricted Funds**

These funds represent donations with specific instructions OR funds for projects that we have been saving for and using when appropriate. These funds are different from budgeted accounts which use pledge donations when needed to pay the bills. We maintain Restricted Funds monies in the bank.

The Salary Allocation Account was a place holder to allow us to "pretend" we were spending money on Clergy salary even though we did not have a priest yet. That way we kept our budget as a whole ready to accommodate that expense when the time came. We will discontinue that approach in 2024 and use normal budget expense accounts to pay salary related costs.


### 2024 Budget

Pledge Donations	\$66,000	-\$624	Many of our members have increased their pledge levels. Many thanks
Expenses	\$64,650	+\$4,900	This increase is from the addition of Clergy Compensation to our other expenses.
Unspent Funds	\$1,350	A Lot!!!	But that's because we had such a bounty in 2023. Modest assumptions for 2024 keep us in the black.

The detail for the proposed budget was shared at the Annual Meeting and is available to those who were absent. There is some wiggle room here for modest increases in some of the accounts. The proposed budget was approved by the congregation.

#### **Investments**

#### **Vanguard Stock Fund**



Another volatile year but the uptick in December has us above initial investment or \$65,000 with a return on that original investment of 7% and 14% since the beginning of the 2023. Current value of this account is \$69,607.

#### **CD Investments**

This reduces exposure to market volatility while continuing to grow our funds.

We are trying to find the right balance between stocks and CD's.

Total amount in stocks and CDs is \$109,607. Funds in checking account – just under \$40,000

The goal for these funds is to eventually fund some or all of clergy payroll with dividends. We may also need these funds for major projects or emergency repairs.

Overall – we are in very good shape financially. Many thanks to all who have been faithful in fulfilling their pledges and to those who have been so generous with unexpected donations. God bless us, every one.

## Recipe

### **Hash Brown Casserole**

## Ingredients:

2# bag of shredded hash browns

1 c Diced Onion

1-2 cups Cheddar Shreds

1 pt Sour Cream

1 can cream of celery or chicken soup

1 stick of butter



#### Directions:

Mix together Cheddar Shreds, Sour Cream, Soup and Butter in a casserole dish and heat in the oven until cheese and butter are melted. Stir in potatoes and onion.

Bake at 375 degrees for 1 hour. If desired, top with more cheese or crushed potato chips near the end of baking time.
