Financial Updates

April is the most recent month reviewed by the Vestry. The basic figures (full numbers only, rounded up) are below:

Pledge donations are above budgeted amounts for another month. There were several extra generous donations that are much appreciated. Total income is exaggerated by the transfer of Curacy Funding from our Restricted Accounts to the P&L. This will help us cover Supply Priest Expenses. It will continue to make YTD income look higher than expected so we need to be careful to not get too excited in the coming months. Expenses came in below monthly budget amounts even thought Utilities were over budget again. Can't wait for the warmer weather.

However, the Clergy Housing and Clergy Salary accounts, which we will not need immediately, artificially make our Total Expense-to-Total Budget numbers look favorable. If you back those funds out of the total, Expenses were over budget this month by \$514 (not a real problem, it will improve when the furnace stops running). Vestry has approved the transfer of these Clergy funds to Restricted Cumulative Salary Allocation (like we did last year) with the intention to transfer to Vanguard at year's end. This will make actual expense spending easier to track.:

The Restricted Funds -

- Vestry decided to use the funds from the spring concert and some other donations to establish a Building Improvement fund. This will help cover costs for door repair and replacement and other big ticket repair needs.
- Outreach Teen Relief provided \$300 to Dryden High School for Prom & Project Graduation
- Current balance in Restricted is \$17,042 most of which is in funds for the Bell Project.
- Vanguard Investment Account total value \$81,467 as of April 30, 2023
- ETF Investment Original investment \$65,000. Current Value close to \$60,021. About the same as
 last month. Vestry approved moving the balance from this fund to a more general ETF fund
 (Vanguard Total Stock Market VTI) that has a better track record (7.24% YTD). This will be completed before the next meeting.
- CD \$21,000. This will remain stable until next year when interest is added to the amount.






The final look – what an improvement!

Buried Treasures

This is a super easy party pleaser.

1c mayo

1/3 c horseradish

1t dry mustard

1t lemon juice

1/2 t salt

1lb small cooked shrimp (peeled and tails off)

1 pint cherry tomatoes (leave whole)

1 can small pitted black olives (drained)

1/2 head cauliflower florets (optional)



Combine mayo and seasonings. Fold in remaining ingredients.

This is best prepped a day ahead and refrigerated overnight.
