Our preparations will be crashed by John the Baptist. Beneath his rough exterior lies a man smitten with a passionate love for God and people.




Join us at The Bells for a morning of singing everyone's favorite carols.

FINANCIAL REPORT

This is the most recent month for review

Overview: Donations were lower than expected this month. There was a hiccup in recording the collection plate at the end of the month and mid-week checks tucked in the Counting folder – those donations will show up in the November report. Of note, the CD interest is offsetting the shortage in donations.

Expenses were higher than expected for the month but our YTD totals provide a buffer and we're still looking good.

Vanguard Funds:

Vanguard Money Market: \$66,938 – this reflects moving our original investment to an interest generating account

Total value of the account is \$123,713. This is very close to a 100% increase of our original investment of \$65,000.
