I will never, ever forget Christmas morning, 2014. It was the first Christmas after my divorce, and, for the first time in my life, I woke up alone on Christmas morning. I felt a sadness that day that was among the worst in my life. No presents, no fellowship, no joy. Just a strong feeling of loneliness.

What brought me out of it (and I have told this story many times) was a small Christmas Day service organized by the Rev. Lydia Speller, the priest at Grace Episcopal, Port Huron. We had never had Christmas Day services before. But we had one that morning in 2014, and I will forever be indebted to Lydia for conducting the service.

Although I about crawled into church that

morning, I walked out feeling much inspired. Being reminded of the hope that comes with the birth of the Savior was enough to renew my spirits. Not only



that, but a church service gave me something to do—and having something to do is a great way to combat loneliness.

Perhaps this Christmas we can all make an effort to reach out to those who are alone. A phone call or a visit go a long way in lifting the spirits of those who are by themselves during the holidays. What a generous present that would be.

Financial Updates

October is the most recent month reviewed by the Vestry. The basic figures (full numbers only, rounded up) are below:

Our YTD figures continue to be in the black but it looks like it will be a close race to stay there by year's end.

Dreamy Turkey Pasta Casserole

Thanks, Connie!

Yields 6 servings

Ingredients

4 tbsp olive oil, divided, plus more for dish

8 oz Messe rigatoni

1 large onion

1 lb. cremini mushrooms, quartered

2 large cloves garlic, finely chopped

2 tbsp fresh thyme

4 c spinach

1/2 c fresh flat-leaf parsley, chopped

3 tbsp all-purpose flour

3 c whole milk

8 oz Gruyere cheese, coarsely grated

1/4 tsp cayenne

Kosher salt & pepper

3 c shredded leftover cooked turkey or chicken



Directions

- 1. Heat oven to 400°F. Oil 3-quart or 9 x 13" casserole dish. Cook pasta per package directions
- 2. Meanwhile, heat 2 tablespoons oil in large skillet on medium. Add onion and cook, covered, stirring occasionally, until tender, 6 to 8 minutes. Add mushroom and cook, tossing occasionally, until tender, 5 to 6 minutes. Stir in garlic and thyme and cook 1 minute. Transfer to large bowl and toss with spinach and parsley.
- 3. Wipe out skillet and heat remaining 2 tablespoons oil on medium. Sprinkle flour over top and cook, stirring 1 minute. Gradually whisk in milk. Simmer, whisking often, until thickened, 4 to 5 minutes. Remove from heat and add Gruyere, cayenne, 3/4 teaspoon salt, and 1/4 teaspoon pepper; stir until cheese melts and sauce is just smooth.
- 4. Fold turkey and pasta into cheese mixture and toss to coat. Fold in spinach mixture.
- 5. Transfer to prepared dish. Bake until heated through, 10 to 12 minutes.





An Advent Practice that takes it One Word at a Time

Forward Movement has announced the 2022 reflection words for AdventWord, a global online advent calendar and community of disciples. For nearly a decade AdventWord has inspired followers of Jesus who wish to add an accessible prayer practice to their daily routine during this holy season.

Daily meditations and images—inspired by a prompt word selected from the daily lectionary readings—were released at adventword.org, on Sunday, November 27.

Participants can sign up to receive this daily message, in English and Spanish, by email or by following AdventWord on social media.

Many followers join the creativity each

year by sharing their own personal reflections across social media using #AdventWord. Participants respond with photos, written responses, crafts, drawings, poems, found art, and other creative expressions inspired by the day's selected word.

"This year we enlisted volunteer community members to help with the selection of prompt words from the daily lectionary readings," said Richelle Thompson, managing editor at Forward Movement. "The online gathering of dozens of AdventWord community members was an inspiring way to kick off the planning for 2022 and a strong reminder that AdventWord is community-driven."
