#### A Culture of Experimentation


- We continually discern the unique identity and gifts of our congregation.

We had an amazing couple of days in Saginaw this weekend for our Fourth Joint Convention of the Episcopal Dioceses of Eastern and Western Michigan!

Throughout our convention, we participated in learning through our workshops and excellent keynote from the Rt. Rev. Craig Loya on the diverse ecology of church. We heard about opportunities and ministries happening throughout our dioceses through reports. And we conducted some business, too!

During Eastern Michigan's business session, they heard a financial report from our diocesan treasurer and CFO, had a moment to recognize the ministry of Camp Chickagami and how they responded to a crisis within the camp family this year, and conducted



elections.

There will be a special Bi-Diocesan Convention in March of 2024 in Grand Blanc to vote on the proposed merger of the Eastern and Western Diocese. There will be multiple opportunities prior to the convention to review the details of the merger



and changes to diocesan practices. We will be sure to inform everyone when any sessions are scheduled close by.

#### The BIG Reveal!

Deacon Beckett finally took the wraps off his big project – the Ausable Inclusion Center in Mio. Beckett has been laying the groundwork to transform the building that formerly

was St. Bartholomew's Church, closed in 2022, into a place where people marginalized by their sexual orientation, gender or socio-economic status can find safety and support for their needs. The Center will focus on four pillars – Social/Emotional Support, Material Support, Spiritual Support and Education



and Advocacy.

Though the building itself is in good shape, there's much to do. And it's not practical to manage it from afar. SOOOO.... the LeClaire family will be moving north in 2024. St. John's will miss them but we're also excited for them and for the people in northern Michigan.

### **Financial Updates for Financials through September 2023**

September is the most recent month to be reviewed by the Vestry. The basic figures (full numbers only, rounded up) are below:

Pledge donations for September were \$4,642 which was under expected amounts by \$291. The YTD donations look much better due to some generous donations made over the year. All in all, we're doing well here.

Expenses continue to run under budget but the heating season has started so it's good to have a cushion for higher bills.

The YTD Net Profit number continue to be great.

The Restricted Funds -

Since the Bell Project is completed, Vestry decided to take the remaining funds (roughly \$2,200) and add them to our Building Improvement restricted amount. This covers some of the smaller building projects. Our Jr. Warden anticipates we may need to paint the outside of the church next year – if there's anything left here, we may need it then.

#### Vanguard Investment Account – as of September, 2023

- Vanguard Total Stock ETF Current value \$62,066. Down from last month
- CD \$21,000. This will remain stable until next year when interest is added to the amount.
- Total value of account is \$83,066.

#### New CD at Oxford Bank

As decided in last month's Vestry meeting, we have invested \$10,000 in an 8 month CD at Oxford Bank at a rate of 5.27%. This is listed on the Balance Sheet as CD-Painting Project, along with our checking account funds.

# **Apple Dumplings**

#### From Ina Dockham

- 2 Granny Smith apples peeled, cored, cut in 8 pieces
- 2 cans crescent rolls
- 1c butter
- 1c sugar
- 1t vanilla
- cinnamon
- 1 can mountain dew

Roll each apple slice in one crescent triangle. Put bundles in buttered 9x13 pan Melt butter; add sugar and vanilla Pour over apple bundles

- Pour soda pop around edges of the pan
- Sprinkle with cinnamon

Bake in preheated 350 degree oven for 40 minutes
