Dear Friends,

I wonder how Lazarus felt when he heard that Jesus had been crucified. Maybe incredulous, horrified, grief stricken? How could such a good man, clearly from God, come to such an end? I wonder how Lazarus felt when he heard that Jesus had risen from the dead. Joyful, surely. But I don't think he was completely surprised. He knew such things were possible. He was alive because such things ARE possible. If they had met again, I think Lazarus would have said, "I knew you would come back". Lazarus was one of the first people to practice resurrection. As followers of Jesus, we need to practice resurrection too.

Don't get me wrong – St. John's is a lonnnggg way from needing CPR. While Rev. Tom's departure is an unpleasant surprise, it is NOT the end of our church. As several members have expressed, ALL of us make up St. John's. Our church is more than one priest, or even one senior warden. The early churches in Paul's epistles did not have clergy. They had strong leadership (sometimes too strong!) and strong bonds

with each other. We have 3 excellent Worship Leaders who have been known to deliver some pretty good sermons. We have a strong Vestry with many years of experience at St. John's. And visitors



remember the love they see among us. That's how folks know we are Christians, right?

The Vestry is working on the practical next-steps. I'm in the process of finding Supply Clergy. Some good news – I contacted Rev. Barb (who is enjoying her cruise IM-MENSELY) to ask if she would visit us again and she quickly replied that she would be delighted to do so. She doesn't come home until May and she has some plans for the next couple of months – but we may very well see her this summer. Vestry meets with Canon Tracie Little, from the Diocese, on Friday, April 14 to learn more about the search process for new clergy. Taste & See Taco Night - Muy Bien!



Combine all and fill egg halves. Sprinkle with paprika for


