Bible Study Resuming September 13th



Has Your IRA become an IOU to the IRS?

If you have an IRA and are of a certain age when the government is requiring you to make withdrawls from your IRA, you know that means taxes are coming due as well. IF you would like to deny the IRS the joy of collecting those tax dollars, there is a way.....

Any charitable donation from your IRA to a non-profit organization, like St. John's for instance, is tax free!!!! All you need to do is call the folks at your IRA organization and arrange a donation, like to St. John's for instance, and they will cut the check, mail it out and adjust your records to show there's less there for taxes. It has to come from your IRA custodian, not from you after receiving the distribution. Some of us feel good when we donate AND when we legally reduce our taxes. Think about it -you have until December 31st but you don't need to wait that long!





Financial Updates for Financials through July 2023

July is the most recent month to be reviewed by the Vestry. The basic figures (full numbers only, rounded up) are below:

Pledge donations for June were above budgeted amounts for the month. YTD continues to look very good.

Looking at YTD Expenses, most of the accounts that were over budget last month are coming into line with expectations.

The YTD Net Profit number continue to be great.

The Restricted Funds – A few disbursements to note.

- We donated funds raised during our Garage Sale to Immanuel Church in Oxford to help with their bell refurbishment project
- The last phase of **our** bell project was completed and final payment made.

Deacon Beckett now has a discretionary fund made with donations from his ordination.

Vanguard Investment Account – as of July 31, 2023

- Vanguard Total Stock ETF Current value \$65,408. Finally an increase over the amount originally invested.
- CD \$21,000. This will remain stable until next year when interest is added to the amount.

Italian Crescent Zucchini Pie submitted by Kathy Wagester.

This recipe has some history – it comes from Kathy's mom and is a favorite with her family. With Zucchini so bountiful right now, it sounds wonderful.

Ingredients:

- 1 package of refrigerated crescent roll dough
- 4 cups Zucchini, sliced
- 1 cup Onion, chopped
- ¹/₄ cup Margerine
- ¹/₂ cup parsley, chopped
- 2 eggs, well beaten
- 8 oz. Mozzarella or cheddar cheese
- ¹/₂ tsp. Salt & Petter
- ¹/₄ tsp. Garlic Powder
- ¹/₄ tsp. sweet Basil
- ¹/₂ tsp. oregano
- Dash of Dijon mustard


Directions:

Spread one can of crescent roll dough in a pie pan including up the sides

Spread Dijon mustard all over the dough.

School Supplies for another year

We gathered quite a stash of school supplies this year. They were going to both Dryden High School and Dryden Elementary as well as to Susan McNary's 1st grade class. Buying the supplies is so much fun. We hope our students have a wonderful and fun year.











Cook Zucchini and onion in margarine until tender (about 10 minutes) then drain.

Stir in parsley and the rest of the seasonings.

In a large bowl, blend in eggs, cheese, and veggie mixture. Mix well. Pour veggie mixture evenly over dough.

Bake at 375° for 18 to 20 minutes.

NOTE. Before you begin, it's best to place the zucchini slices in a colander over the sink or a large bowl. Shake a little salt over the zucchini, then toss a few times in the colander to coat. Allow the zucchini to drain for an hour before proceeding. This will remove excess moisture from the zucchini and give you a better result in the final dish.
